Don't Know Who We Are... Spay and Neuter Solutions was founded as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization on July 1, 2003, to address the issue of unchecked reproduction among companion animals. Pet overpopulation is an issue of great concern to virtually every animal welfare organization, many of which are overwhelmed by the number of homeless or abused pets in our communities.

The goal of Spay and Neuter Solutions is to help make Arizona a pioneer state that can soon claim "no more homeless animals." We are a member of AWASA (Animal Welfare Alliance of Southern Arizona) and work closely with other animal welfare organizations, each of which has its own mission and goals. The sole focus of Spay and Neuter Solutions is in its name: we concentrate all of our efforts on spay and neuter issues.

We **PROVIDE FINANCIAL**

ASSISTANCE to defray the cost of spaying and neutering for individuals in need, and we **EDUCATE** pet owners about the importance of these procedures in preventing the birth of unwanted animals and in improving the quality of life for their pets.

Looking Back at Recent Spay/Neuter Successes

We successfully closed our second fiscal year at the end of June. We helped to spay and neuter 1,423 animals during our two years of existence! We couldn't have done it without your generous support. Your donations keep us going.

Naturally, we are working hard applying for grants and raising money in any way we can to continue this important work.

In August, we organized the National Homeless Animals Day again, and, like last year, a large group of people joined us for an



emotional Pet Blessing and a beautiful Candlelight Vigil at the Udall Park Amphitheater. The mayor's office

issued a proclamation, and Dr. Scott Ruth, owner and surgeon of Animal Birth Control of Tucson, talked about his lifetime commitment to reducing pet overpopulation. His clinics -- now at two locations -- offer the lowest cost

for spaying and neutering companion animals in Tucson.

September marked the sad event of hurricanes



Katrina and Wilma. Our organization was among the first to offer help to the unaltered animals of the survivors arriving in Tucson.

November 21 marked our first "TOM & MOM DAY" featuring \$5.00 spay/neuter surgeries for male and female cats of lowincome families or caregivers of feral cat colonies. In addition, ABC of Tucson donated free rabies shots.

December 3-4 is the traditional International Bazaar at the St. Michael's Church, where we spread the word of our existence,



share our knowledge with the public, and offer help for people who are financially drained and cannot afford to spay or neuter


Volunteering: We have a special project for those of you who love to sew -- making crafts to sell as a fundraiser. In addition, we are always looking for volunteers to
