#### For Those of You Who Don't Know Who We Are...

Spay and Neuter Solutions was founded as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization on July 1, 2003. Pet overpopulation is an issue of great concern to virtually every animal welfare organization, many of which are overwhelmed by the number of homeless or abused pets in our communities. The goal of Spay and Neuter Solutions is to help make Arizona a pioneer state that can soon claim "no more homeless animals." We work closely with other animal welfare organizations, each of which has its own mission and goals. The sole focus of Spay and Neuter Solutions is in its name: we concentrate all of our efforts on spay and neuter issues.

We are dedicated to **PREVENTION** and EDUCATION. We provide for free and low-cost spay/neuter surgeries for companion animals in our community. We have negotiated discounted rates with participating vet clinics, and we pay all or part of this cost, depending on the need of the client. We also educate pet owners about the importance of spay/neuter in preventing the birth of unwanted animals and in improving the quality of life for their pets. # **A Year of Milestones**

The sixth year of our operations has marked several important and exciting milestones for us and for the animals and people we help.

In fiscal year 2008-2009, we facilitated a **record-setting 1,020 spay/neuter surgeries**. Of those, 554 were cats, and 466 were dogs. We expect to reach an overall total of 5,000 surgeries by the end of December.


We also raised an **all-time-high** of more than \$70,000 in funds. Thank you so much to all of our generous and dedicated donors, both individuals and foundations, whose support is vital to the success of our work.

The most exciting news of all, however, is our newest endeavor. We are partnering with our friends at the nonprofit organization The Center for Animal Rescue and Adoption to open a high-quality, high-volume, accessible and affordable spay/neuter clinic within the coming year.

Having access to our own clinic, slated to open in March 2010, will increase our capacity to provide preventative spay/neuter surgeries and ultimately save the lives of more dogs and cats. In one year, we will be able to provide more spay/neuter surgeries than it has taken us more than five years to achieve with our current voucher programs. Our high-volume clinic

will perform 5,000 to 6,000 spay/neuter surgeries every year.

financial assistance to those who cannot afford the regular low-cost rates for spay/neuter services our clinic will provide, but the clinic facility will give us the resources we need to help more people and more animals than ever before.

The ultimate goal of increasing spay/neuter is decreasing animal shelter intake. In our community, more than 35,000 dogs and cats end up in local animal shelters every year. Prevention is one of the keys to stopping this tragic situation.

To raise funds for the clinic, we are planning a special event featuring Faith Maloney of Best Friends at the Zellweger Mansion on Tuesday, November 17. Faith is one of the co-founders of the renowned Best Friends Animal Sanctuary in Utah, where she is Director of Animal Services overseeing all aspects of animal care at the sanctuary, including the clinic and adoption programs.
