Goodbye to a Good Friend



It is with deep regret and sorrow that I am informing our supporters that

our co-founder and Vice President Coralie (Corey) Ames passed away on February 11, 2010. During the past seven years Corey was a tireless volunteer, helping animals and their owners on a daily basis. Although a snow-bird (she spent only six months in Tucson) she never stopped working for our community; she even received and returned calls while driving back and forth between Seattle and Tucson. She migrated to Seattle every year with her three cats, who received the royal treatment enroute.

Corey's heart was always with animals, especially "community" (aka feral) cats. In Washington, besides taking care of daily business, she was trapping homeless cats and taking them to be spayed/neutered, even feeding them during their recoverv.

Her memorial service was held on April 10th in Olympia, Washington, where her family, friends, former students and faculty members said tearful goodbyes to her. Those attending the service were asked to make donations to Spay and Neuter Solutions in lieu of flowers.

Corey will never be forgotten; we will continue our work carrying her memory in our hearts.
